## Difficulty: Easy

#### Finished Size:

Arrow pouch = 16" long x 1.75" across

Gauge: 14 sts/13 rows = 4"/10cm in sc



#### Materials:

- ◆ G/6 (4.00 mm) hook
- Red Heart Super Saver or any sturdy worsted weight yarn, about 125 yds
- Yarn needle

# Abbreviations:

ch = chain

inc = increase by making 2 sts in each st

sc = single crochet

sl st = slip stitch

## Directions

## Base (make 2)

Rnd 1: Ch 2; make 6 sc in 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook.

Rnd 2: [Sc inc] in each st around. (12 sc)

Rnd 3: [Sc in next st, sc inc in next st] around. (18 sc)

Sl st in next st; finish off.

To Customize: Increase Base by evenly spacing six increases per round until all arrows gathered together will fit in the circle you have created with some room to spare.

#### Side:

Row 1: Ch 56. Sc in 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook and each ch across. (55 sc) Turn.

Rows 2-18: Ch 1; sc in each st across. Turn.

Finish off.

To Customize: The starting chain determines how deep your arrow pouch will be. For longer arrows, increase chain. For shorter arrows, decrease chain. Be sure to make your arrow pouch a little shorter than your arrows so that they will stick out the top. If you increased the Base of the quiver, you will need to crochet as many Rows of the side as there are stitches in the last Round of the Base. (So if your Base is 24 sc around, crochet 24 Rows of the Side.)

#### Strap

Row 1: Ch 7. Sc in  $2^{nd}$  ch from hook and each across. (6 sc) Turn.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each st across. Turn.

Repeat Row 2 until Strap reaches 20" or desired length; finish off.

*To Customize:* Increase starting chain to widen strap; shorten or lengthen by working fewer or more rows.

## Finishing:

- 1. Sew first and last rows of Side together to form long tube.
- 2. Sew both Bases together (this will help discourage arrows from poking through the stitches) and then sew them across one end of the tube.
- 3. Attach Strap to the Side. Weave in all ends.
